A Message from the Headteacher

Living Life in the Fast Lane!

Dear Parents and Carers

Another week has flown by and sadly, the pace of school life is such, coupled with a minor technical issue over the weekend, means that I am uploading this in a new week. Apologies for the delay.

In Nursery, our pupils have carried on their work on Farmer Duck and have looked at the different habitats that the animals live in. Look at the picture above to see who lives in a coop!

In Reception, children have been scientists this week – investigating smells, exploring sinking and floating, learning about amphibians and observing our own tadpoles hatching from frogspawn.

In Year 1, pupils looked at the artwork of Andy Goldsworthy, using spirals and making snail prints!

Year 2 pupils have been learning all about Victorian Inventions.

Year 3 pupils met Meri the Egyptian time traveller and learnt about mummification and hieroglyphics. They also became scribes using papyrus and reeds.

In Year 4, pupils have made 4 different types of Egyptian pyramids and have started to draft their own version of The Egyptian Cinderella story.

In Year 5, pupils have used 'Scratch' on the laptops to make music. Ask your child how they did this and what Scratch does to help make this happen!

Year 6 have taken part in 'Battle of the Beaks'. For this they used chopsticks, pegs and spoons to represent the different beaks of the finches that Darwin saw on Galapagos islands and how they were adapted to the type of food available.

Also during this week, we had a visit from our school improvement advisor, checking in to see how things are going in every class. He watched Phonics in Early Years along with Maths and History in every class. He also got to look at a selection of books throughout school and interview some children too. He was so impressed with the way that the children responded, their work books and their attitudes to learning in all areas. I'm so proud of you all for showing him what we already know! I am also grateful to all of the staff who continue to provide such wonderful learning opportunities every day.

Boo is visiting...



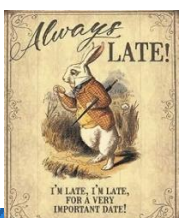
