A Message from the Headteacher

What a Washout!

Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has seen such a mixed bag in terms of weather – we started our week with lots of wet playtimes and whilst the sun came out (momentarily) midweek, it was quite blustery and bitterly cold. Please use this to remind your children about the need to wear their coats! We have been reminding children to keep them on at school when they play out to avoid a big pile of lost property too! We have had some lovely Forest School sessions this week though – the weather never gets in the way of those! (picture above)

In classes, Nursery children have been watching CCTV footage of visiting dinosaurs! They have found footprints and have also been on a dinosaur hunt!

Reception pupils have been chatting about what they have been doing in the Easter holidays but they have been writing these like a newspaper report! They have also loved seeing their friends again and playing together. Children have been looking at ‘teen’ numbers in Maths too.

Year 1 children have started work on their new Geography work on ‘Where do you live? In Maths, they have been counting in 2’s and 10’s. In English, they have been exploring the story of Farmer Duck and in Science they have completed their investigation to find the best material for a cloak.

Year 2 pupils had a package delivered with a letter, old photographs and a 114 year old bear called Polar in it. The children have looked at features of a letter and have written letters to Polar too!

Year 3 children been introduced to their new Rain Forest topic and have explored the parts of a plant in Science. In Art, they have looked for shapes and have worked hard to produce fantastic still life drawings.

Year 4 pupils have impressed us this week by converting mixed numbers to improper fractions. In English, they have become naturally curious about natural disasters! They have instructed fictional characters on ‘How to escape from a volcanic eruption’ and have designed their own emergency survival kits.

Year 5 children have been looking at area and perimeter in Maths and ‘retrofuturism’ in Art. They have also started to write their own space poetry in English and have been learning how mountains are formed In Geography.

Year 6 pupils begin new units of electricity in Science and photography in Art. They have been writing recipes in English and so maybe you will find your children in the kitchen at weekend making you something delightful for their evening meal!

This week has whizzed by in what seemed like the speed of light. Take some time to relax at weekend and enjoy a little bit of calm.

Boo the Badger

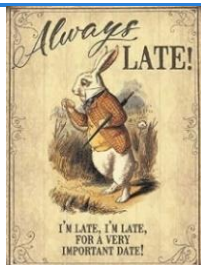


Each Monday in assembly, our school mascot, ‘Boo the Badger’ visits two classes in school – one infant and one junior and stays for the week in their classrooms.
