A Message from the Headteacher

Testing, Testing...one...two...

Dear Parents and Carers,

Another mixed week in terms of our fortunes with the weather – and this leads to lots of lost property! Hot one day so we all take our cardigans and jumpers off – raining the next, so coats are everywhere! To make sure these items get back to you, please make sure they are named!

This week in classes, Nursery have completed their 'Shoe Box Habitats' – A picture of one of these can be seen above. They were all set up in the hall and classes were invited to see them in their very own exhibition. Well done Nursery – they are gorgeous! Nursery children have also been playing 'What time is it Mr. Wolf?', chalking phonemes and playing in the garden.

Reception pupils have continued to look at fairy tales, this week learning all about Hansel and Gretel. They have been sequencing the story using a story map. They have loved their new role play area set up as a school, pretending to be teachers and getting children to read to them! In Maths, children have been looking at rotating 2D shapes and have loved making their own tangram animals.

Year 1 pupils have been learning about halves in Maths. They have been making sure to be accurate when halving objects or quantities and making things equal. In Music, children have looked at seaside pictures to try and understand what sounds they would hear at the seaside and thinking about how they could make those sounds using musical instruments. In Geography, the children have designed and written their own postcards from a different part of the United Kingdom, writing about their favourite tourist attractions that they have visited.

In Year 2, pupils were excited to see a mysterious box that Mr. Fletcher had found in the garage when having a sort out. It seems to have in it some artefacts that could have belonged to a passenger on the Titanic and as Y2 are learning about this, they have been writing to the Titanic museum in Liverpool using their letter writing skills. They have also been looking at thirds, three quarters and gaining an understanding that two quarters is equivalent to one half.

Year 3 pupils have been doing some descriptive writing based on their rainforest work. They have also been learning and applying tricky spellings to their writing. In Music, children have been Scat singing and learning about ragtime jazz. In Design Technology, pupils have been designing exotic birds to apply their sewing skills! Finally, ask your child what they have been learning in French too!

Year 4 pupils have been creating their own mythical creatures and writing a myth about them. In Geography, children have been continuing to explore their topic on 'Extreme Earth' and looking at different volcanoes around the world. They have also been superstars with practicing their timetables ready for their multiplication check after the holidays.

Year 5 pupils have been learning about the orbit of the Earth around the sun to create seasons. They have also learnt how to use a protractor in Maths and how computers speak in binary code. In English, they have been writing a flashback narrative.

Year 6 pupils have confirmed for us what a fabulous group of young people they are. They have displayed maturity beyond their years as they have made the final preparations for SAT's next week. They really deserve a weekend in the sunshine.

Despite the mass preparations that take place at this time of year for tests in Year 1 for Phonics, Year 2 for their non-statutory assessments, Year 4 for Multiplication tests and Year 6 SAT's, teachers continue to deliver a full curriculum that is fun and inventive. Lots of hard work but some lovely play opportunities too!

Boo the Badger

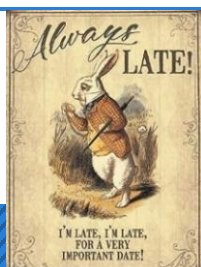


Each Monday in assembly, our school mascot, 'Boo the Badger' visits two classes in school – one infant and one junior and stays for the week in their classrooms.
