Dear Parents and Carers

What a 'game of two halves' this week has been. Hard work in the form of testing versus good fun and laughter delivered through exciting lessons and fun events.

In classes this week, Nursery pupils have been investigating seeds and growing cress. They have been talking about healthy foods and painting flowers using celery and peppers. They have also been measuring carrots and counting vegetables that you may find in a vegetable patch.

In Reception, children 'went on a trip' to storyland and acted out the story of 'The Enormous Turnip'. The children sequenced the story, planted broad beans, chopped up a variety of vegetables and learnt what happens when you cook them.

Year 1 pupils have worked in groups this week to plan a recipe for a fruit smoothie. In Maths, they have been finding quarters and groups of objects and quarters of shapes. In Science, they have been finding out which parts of a plant our favourite fruits and vegetables come from. In Forest School, the children have been creating pictures using the Japanese art of 'hapa zome'. A picture of this can be seen at the top of the page. Ask your child what it means!

Year 2 children have completed their KS1 Reading papers. They have all worked so hard and have done so well – we are all very proud of them! Pupils have also written letters to the Titanic Museum and have finished all of their work on fractions.

Year 3 children have written and edited their rainforest descriptions. They have finished their work on fractions and are ready to start learning all about money next week. They have had lots of fun making parrots from their designs and have been working hard on their listening skills and resilience. Keep it up, Year 3!

Year 4 pupils have completed writing their myths. They have used a variety of sentence structures and applied their knowledge of how to write detailed character descriptions. In Maths, they learned all about decimals as fractions. They ended the week with lots of fun by investigating heating and cooling with chocolate and ice lollies in Science. We have been so proud of their behaviour this week too. Keep up the good work, Year 4!

Year 5 pupils have done drama with play scripts, angles and shapes in Maths, the phases of the moon in and the solar system in Science and the seven summits in Geography. As if that wasn't enough, they have also completed some epic multimedia retro futuristic pictures in art.

Year 6 pupils have shown determination, resilience and composure during their week doing their Key Stage 2 SAT's. We are all so unbelievably proud of them and can't wait to get started on the Leavers' production with auditions coming up next week.

With our fabulous 'Colour Run' event to cap the week off, we will all be ready for a rest and recharge when the holiday appears. Only one week to go, Woodies!

Boo the Badger

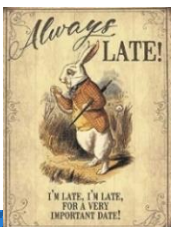


Each Monday in assembly, our school mascot, 'Boo the Badger' visits two classes in school – one infant and one junior and stays for the week in their classrooms.
