A Message from the Headteacher

All work, some play...

Dear Parents and Carers

There may well have been a hiatus on newsletters for the past few weeks, there certainly hasn't been any stopping our Woodies from working and playing hard!

In classes this week, Nursery pupils have continued to look at mini beasts. They have looked at butterfly symmetry, made pictograms of their favourite minibeasts, have looked at lots of Tales Toolkit stores and have enjoyed being in the garden in the sun (now that it is finally here!)

In Reception, there has been a special delivery of a pot full of caterpillars that were delivered on Monday. The children have been learning about the life cycle of the caterpillar. The children have also been creating their own landscape pictures for the Sky Arts project.

Year 1 pupils have been learning about the history of the motor car and have started to think about how vehicles move in DT. The children have also been enjoying stories from other cultures and writing news reports about a runaway goat in a Nigerian market!

Year 2 children have been doing lots of animal poetry and have focused on using expanded noun phrases. They have also been writing some acrostic poems. In Geography, children have been looking at hot and cold places and considering why they are those temperatures.

Year 3 pupils joined a live link with the WWF on Rainforest Day, finding out about deforestation. They have also learned how to play rounders in the sunshine, have been telling the time using digital and analogue clocks and have been writing independently to show how much they have learnt. Your teachers are so proud of the progress you have all made!

Year 4 children have been explaining how seismographs work in English – Ask your child what they do – I had it explained to me beautifully this week! In Maths, they have applied their learning about decimals to money. At swimming, they faced water safety week and had to swim in their pyjamas. They have also completed some end of year tests – your teachers are so proud of your stamina and resilience Year 4!

Year 5 pupils have been creating their own children's book based on 'The Gruffalo' for their reading partners. The children are very much looking forward to reading them to them next week. They have also been learning about human and physical features of North America in Geography and geocentric vs heliocentric models of the solar system in Science. Year 5 have also enjoyed the responsibility of being the oldest pupils in school this week whilst Year 6 were out on their residential. What good practice for Y6!

Year 6 pupils went on their long awaited residential trip to PGL in Shropshire. They enjoyed rifle range shooting, canoeing, Problem Solving, High Wire, Zip Wire, Jacob's ladder and so much more. Am always in awe of our children and staff who enter into this so wholeheartedly – they are certainly braver than I am when it comes to these type of activities. Well done everyone. I know you have the time of your lives.
