Children were interviewed at length about their curriculum, what they learn, what they have learned previously and also about their behaviour, the behaviour of others and their own personal growth and development. # A Message from the Headteacher

## Busy, Busy, Busy!

Dear Parents and Carers

The final furlong is in sight and despite the perception that the end of a school year is full of DVD's and play days, this couldn't be further from the truth. We still have final units of the curriculum to teach, assessments to be completed, sports day, Meet the Teacher transition events not to mention the small matter of 431 reports to write and send out. It is the busiest term of all and time is flying by!

In classes this week, Nursery children have been learning about ladybirds and recalling ladybird facts. Ask your child what they can remember about ladybirds!

In Reception, children have been creating their own football flags, playing finger football, designing football kits and writing descriptions about the football they see in photographs – if only the England team would put this much effort into their study of the game we may have more positive results! In Maths, the children have been looking at positional language and mapping. They have also been observing their caterpillars, all of which have turned into chrysalises (apart from one.)

Year 1 children have been finding out how axels work in DT and have been doing artwork linked to the first car. They have also been completing a class daily weather chart (lots of weather to report recently!) and they have also been writing their own newspaper reports.

Year 2 pupils have been doing Maths tests, planning their own story of 'Bog Baby' and looking at human and physical features of hot and cold countries.

Year 3 pupils have worked incredibly hard on their tests this week. They have made great progress and there have been lots of smiles at their accomplishments. They have also finished work on 'Time', have used calendars and have been testing hand sizes with cubes in Science for Science week.

Year 4 children have also completed their NFER tests and have enjoyed setting up a Science experiment to investigate evaporation. They have also really enjoyed looking at the artist William Morris in Art

Year 5 pupils have worked hard on their tests all week. They have also now read their stories to their reading partners, learnt about the rocky mountains in Geography, named the rooms in their house in French and have talked about the stages of human growth and development in Science ready for discussions next week in SRE.

Year 6 pupils are now in full swing rehearsing for their end of year production of The Lion King. They have also enjoyed some Carnival Dance sessions which has tied in well with their work on Brazil in Geography.

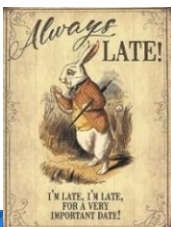
### Boo the Badger
